Dr. Gilbert Month – October

Every year we designate the month of October as "Dr. Gilbert Month". Many of you know that Dr. Fidelia Gilbert served as a medical Missionary in Bangladesh for many years. In her retirement years, Dr. Gilbert lived in Cascade, and was a part of Germantown Church. She was instrumental in raising awareness of missions and missionaries here at Germantown.



Dr. Gilbert's birthday was in October, and so in her honor, we receive a special offering to support the Medical Ministries in Bangladesh. Here is some information about Churches of God ministries in Bangladesh:

With 185 churches in six northwest districts, Bangladesh is our most extensive overseas ministry with departments in community development, education and medicine. In 2015, there were 7,863 members and 88 baptisms were reported by the churches. Student sponsorships (\$20 per month) provide quality education in Khanjanpur for 180 boys and girls from villages who otherwise could not afford it. Khanjanpur also has a blind school. There were 17 nursing school graduates and 24 newly enrolled nursing students in 2015.

Bogra Christian Hospital and Khanjanpur Health & Eye Clinics treated over 106,000 patients in 2015. A nursing program at Bogra equips nurses to work in medical facilities throughout the country. Health education classes are taught in the districts on such topics as hygiene & sanitation, clean drinking water, child marriage, and HIV-Aids prevention.

New Hope Shelter offers food and lodging to men, women, and children. It operates year-round and serves about 150 people a year, of which one-third are children. CHURCHES OF GOD, GENERAL CONFERENCE 55TH TRIENNIAL SESSION

Members of the Churches of God, General Conference, headquartered in Findlay, OH, met in Chambersburg, PA on July 25-27, 2016 for its 55th Triennial Session. Delegates from the regions of the United States where the denomination is located were in attendance, as well as representatives from Bangladesh, Haiti, India and various areas of Latin America.

Dr. William Reist, Findlay, OH, presided over the sessions before turning over the gavel to the new president, Pastor Philip Scott of Latrobe, PA. Pastor Lawrence Metzler of Chambersburg, PA was elected president-elect. Newly elected members to the Administrative Council were Kara Shiffler Bowers, Middletown, PA, Pastor Wayne Good, Newville, PA, Pastor Mark Halliday, Roaring Spring PA, Pastor Matt Ginter, Findlay, OH, Pastor Ross Osborn, Ft. Wayne, IN and Pastor Ryan Cooney, Ripon, CA.

Pastor Lance Finley, Findlay, OH was introduced as the new Executive Director for the denomination and Pastor Ed Rosenberry, Carlisle, PA was acknowledged for his previous service in that capacity.

Dr. Katherine Fell, President of the University of Findlay, Findlay, OH presented the opening devotional thoughts followed by a report on the University by Pastor Matt Ginter, Director of Campus Ministries. Dr. Brent Sleasman, newly appointed President of Winebrenner Theological Seminary, Findlay, OH was introduced.

Keynote speaker for the conference was Michael Breen, author of <u>Building a Discipling Culture</u> and other books and publications. He spoke to the conference theme, "ONe Mission," calling the Church to live as disciples who make disciples.

Dr. Christopher Yuan, co-author with his mother Angela Yuan of <u>Out of a Far Country</u>, spoke to the Conference about his prior life in the gay community and how the church should respond to the current climate in our country concerning this subject. His parents, Dr. and Mrs. Yuan, assisted with the presentation from their point of view.

The sessions concluded with a challenge from incoming president, Pastor Philip Scott.



We hosted a five-day Cave Quest Vacation Bible School from 1-5 August 2016. The week was filled with singing, spelunking adventures and games. All in all we had a total of 40 children attend during the week, the average attendance each day was 28. In addition to the children, 19 adults served in one capacity or another each night.



We celebrated Jesus the Light of the World. On Day One, we learned about Sal the Salamander, Sal reminded us that Jesus gives us Hope. For Bible Quest the children learned how the Prophets had foretold the arrival of the Messiah giving HOPE to the world.



On Day Two, we learned about Mawtha the Moth, who reminded us that Jesus gives us Courage. For Bible Quest the children learned how Jesus gave Peter courage to walk on water.

Day Three, we learned about Radar the noisy bat. Radar taught us that Jesus gives us Direction. For Bible Quest the children learned about the Sermon on the Mount.

Day Four, we learned

about Olivia the barn-owl with a heart-shaped face. Olivia reminded us that Jesus Gives us Love. During Bible Quest the children learned about Jesus's death and resurrection. Jesus showed what real love is by giving his life to save us.



Day Five was a shortened day due to the family picnic and closing, but we learned about Glow the Glowworm. He taught us that Jesus Gives us Power. During Bible Quest the children saw a demonstration of sin's effect on our relationship with Jesus. On Friday, the parents attended the Bible Quest with the Spelunkers.



Friday's closing program included a demonstration of the effect of sin on our relationship with God and how Jesus had to die to repair that relationship.






